As for what's happening in our French classes, AP French students are in the home stretch, working diligently to prepare for their exam on May 12. They have been mastering vocabulary, transitional structures, advanced verb tenses, complex grammatical concepts, and a variety of exam strategies all semester to help ensure their success on the nearly four-hour exam which includes listening, reading, writing, and speaking.

Students in the French 3/French 3 Honors classes have been engaged for the last 4 weeks in a unit on travel. Through a multitude of classroom games and activities addressing the three modes of communication, they have been learning how to identify and describe different travel destinations, discuss the actions they take to prepare for travel, and express the activities they like to do when traveling. They are also learning some more complex grammatical concepts including how to express future actions, using geographical prepositions to say where people go, and using direct object pronouns to reduce the redundancy in their writing/speaking.

All students continue to engage in a written exchange with their pen pals from outside of Toulouse, France with most classes writing on a bi-weekly or tri-weekly basis. We look forward to receiving a care package from our pen pals in the near future.

As this will be my last newsletter of the school year, I want to stay congratulations to all of our Class of 2022 graduates and wish everyone a restful summer. I look forward to working with many of you again in future classes!

Culture Spotlight – May 1st

May Day, or May 1st, is a public and traditional spring holiday in many European cultures. Each culture has different origins and ways to celebrate the holiday, but in France, the first of May is all about two things: *le muguet*, or "lily of the valley", and Labor Day. On the first of May, friends and family offer each other little sprigs, bouquets, or whole plants of muguet for good luck. It is the belief that the more bell-like flowers the plant has, the better the luck. May 1st is also a public holiday, which means that just about everything in France is closed to celebrate. It's considered to be a workers' holiday.

The tradition of giving muguet on the first of May dates all the way back to the reign of Charles IX, when the young King was gifted a branch for good luck. He liked the idea so much that from then on, he gifted every woman in his court a sprig on the first of May each year. From there, it became a custom to give a sprig of muguet as a symbol of springtime.
